WATERMARK CROWN CA (SG 94) AND CROWN OVER A (SG 138) ERRORS, FLAWS, VARIATIONS AND ANOMALIES

The first printing from 1885 was by De La Rue on paper watermarked 'Crown over CA' (indicated by "D") and the second from 1910 by The Commonwealth Stamp Printing Branch on paper watermarked 'Crown over A'(indicated by "C").

As these 2 issues were printed from the same plate, the distinction between the printers and the paper is not relevant to this study.

The De La Rue printing is superb and clear. The Swan is magnificent!

The stamps produced by The Commonwealth Stamp Printing Branch by comparison appear much cruder and more heavily inked.

This is the first investigation into anomalies in these issues

Flaws, errors, variations and anomalies can arise for a variety of reasons and can be divided into 3 main categories

PLATE FLAWS These are consistent and repeated examples arising from some deformation on the printing plate of which more than one example has been identified.

- * including plate wear, cracks or scratches.
- * Variations between stamps on the plate caused during the application transfer roller

These are identified by being printed in bold type

GROUP TWO consist of those which appear to be permanent malformations of the plate but have yet to be confirmed by 2 or more examples

These are identified by being in normal type

TRANSCIENT OR ONE OFF FLAWS

These include anomalies caused by dust or dirt on the plate, paper or in the ink or by paper movement during printing

Some of these can be quite spectacular but are only temporary even if they are occasionally repeated.

These anomalies are printed in italics

Identifying the position of the stamps on the plate from individual stamps is impossible, however from the limited number of blocks of stamps and partial plates available, identification of the position of some of these flaws can be made.

These stamps were printed in 4 panes of 10 stamps wide by 6 stamps deep and each pane can be identified as UPPER LEFT pane LL

LOWER LEFT pane LL UPPER RIGHT pane UR LOWER RIGHT pane LR Regrettably no complete pane in known to exist however Brian Pope's display "Halfpenny Postage Stamps of Western Australia 1884-1912" includes some blocks of stamps coming from identifiable panes.

Brian Pope also possesses a block of 12 from the Upper Left pane (BPP12..)

In addition in the Western Australian Museum archives, partial sheets exist originally from the Bromfield Collection which can also be identified as being from specific panes.

The Willis Collection (which was sold in June 2015) includes a complete upper right pane and a block of 18 from a lower pane (WCP18..)

Flaws etc identified from these sources have been added to those I have already described and shown with reference to the source i.e Brian Popes Presentation (BPP) or WA Museum Archives (WAMA) together with identification if possible of the pane and the position of the stamp on that pane. (e.g Upper left pane second row 9th stamp, UL2/9)

From a relatively small sample of individual stamps examined and from Brian Pope's presentation, from the WA Museum archives and from blocks in the Willis Collection, the following have been identified and have been listed according to the position on the stamp. OUTSIDE FRAME LINE INSIDE DOUBLE OVAL FRAME LINES VERTICAL FLORAL DESIGNS TRIANGULAR CORNER DESIGNS THE SWAN BACKGROUND SHADING "WESTERN AUSTRALIA" AND FRAME LINES "POSTAGE ONE HALF-PENNY" AND FRAME LINES

This summary is limited by the number of stamps examined and would be enhanced by further study.
