ERRORS, FLAWS, VARIETIES AND ANOMALIES

Relatively little research has been done on flaws and varieties on Western Australian stamps.

Some examination of the 1d Carmine (rose, red, pink) of watermark V over Crown and Crown over A has been undertaken with the pioneering work of J.R.W. Purves together with P.C. Pearson in 'Philately from Australia' in December 1971 in which he identified some anomalies in these issues.

These were substantially increased by Murray Sherry and detailed in the 'Black Swan' (Journal of the Western Australian Study group) Vol 8 No 2 June 1994.

Flaws, errors, variations and anomalies can arise for a variety of reasons and can be divided into 3 main categories

- PLATE FLAWS These are consistent and repeated examples arising from some deformation on the printing plate of which more than one example has been identified.
 - * including plate wear, cracks or scratches.
 - * Variations between stamps on the plate caused during the application transfer roller

These are identified by being printed in BOLD TYPE

GROUP TWO consist of those which appear to be permanent malformations of the plate but have yet to be confirmed by 2 or more examples

These are identified by being in <u>normal type</u>.

TRANSIENT OR ONE OFF FLAWS

These include anomalies caused by dust or dirt on the plate, paper or in the ink or by paper movement during printing.

Some of these can be quite spectacular but are only temporary even if they are occasionally repeated

These anomalies are printed in *italics*


From a relatively small quantity of these stamps I have identified the following varieties, variations and flaws.

These varieties are listed according to the position on the stamp for easier identification.

Sometimes it is difficult to distinguish between Plate Flaws and Printing Variations however further investigation may aid such identification.


OUTSIDE FRAME LINE Clockwise




1) NICK OUT OF INSIDE OF OUTER FRAME LINE AT NE CORNER



2) NICK OUT OF INSIDE OF OUTER FRAME LINE AT SE CORNER




3) Inside SW corner thinned

DOUBLE CIRCULAR INNER FRAME LINES Clockwise




1) SE corner ornament protrudes upwards into outside oval

1) TOP OF LEFT LEG OF SIX POINTS UPWARD



2) Base of left leg of 'X' of Six is pointed



3) TOP OF RIGHT ARM OF SIX IS SHORTENED, NOT LEVEL WITH TOP OF LEFT ARM



4) Distorted middle of first 'E' of Pence



5) Bump on middle arm of last 'E' of Pence



6) Middle arm of last 'E' of Pence is shaved off, pointed not square





7) DISTORTED LOWER ARM OF LAST 'E' OF PENCE

8) Frame line thinned in NE corner



9) Words low in frame



10) Words high in frame



11) LINE ACROSS TOP OF LETTERSOIF 'SIX PENCE'
